RABBI'S MESSAGE

This year the first night of Hanukkah occurs at the same time as Christmas Eve. The 25th of the Hebrew month of Kislev on the lunar calendar corresponds this year with the 25th of December on the solar calendar. With the winter solstice on the 21st, both holidays occur at the darkest time of the year in the Northern Hemisphere as the sun's time is at its shortest and the moon diminishes and disappears the first half of Hanukkah and they share some similar themes.

Hanukkah commemorates one of the darkest times in Jewish history, as Antiochus, ruler of the Hellenistic empire in 168 BCE, forbade Jews to practice the religion and desecrated the ancient Temple in Jerusalem. Over three years, the brothers who came to be known as the Maccabees, led an uprising that ousted the Syrian-Greek army and led to the cleansing and rededication of the holy place. According to the Book of Maccabees, the victorious rebels decided to celebrate the last major harvest festival they had been unable to enjoy at its proper time, the eight day festival of Sukkot. A spear with a torch on top was lit for each night, leading to the eight branched menorah we use today.

One hundred years later, the Maccabee descendants had fallen into political factions, one of which invited the Romans to help them out, only to lead to Roman domination over the region.

Our first celebration on the new property was "Break the Fast." The new property added to the excitement of the new year. Rabbi David leads the services on the first and third Fridays of each month while the second and fourth are led by lay volunteers who accept the honor, coordinated by Patricia Smith, our Ritual Committee chairperson.

Another 200 years and violent rebellions against Roman rule that led to decimation and destruction of the Temple, the rabbis who became the leaders then wanted to avoid stirring up violent resistance and so put forth the legend of the bottle of olive oil that lasted eight nights as the origin story for the eight day festival, and an emphasis on spirit, not might. The festival then takes us through that darkest time of the moon and the sun back toward the light, as the last nights of Chanukah occur as the moon begins to grow again and the number of candles grows as well.

December 25th as the official date of Jesus' birth wasn't established until the fourth century, possibly as a way of transitioning from the Roman celebration of the birth of Mithras on that day, or perhaps as a way of taking the 25th of Kislev and putting a similar dark to light passage into the solar calendar. Kindling light in a time of oncoming darkness, the branches of the menorah and the branches of the tree, and the theme of resistance to forces of oppression.

This year, may we realize that our traditions, while quite different, also harbor seeds of unity. May we find a way, together, toward the light, and toward a world freed from oppression of all kinds.


