RABBI'S MESSAGE

There's an old joke about Adam and Cain walking past the charred remains of what had been the Garden of Eden, and Cain asks, "What happened there?" Adam replies: "Your mother ate us out of house and home."

The story of Eden has played a role for millennia in supporting a view of women that has led to the stark contrasts at play in this election. This article is only meant to illuminate the dynamics and does not represent an endorsement for either candidate, but it is worth noting that the first female candidate for president runs against a man who gets mad if dinner isn't waiting when he gets home from work.

"Guarding the Garden" is a musical I conceived and produced in the early 90's, created through improvisation and written by David Schechter, an award winning playwright who has since written screenplays based on Theo van Gogh's movies, starring the likes of Steve Buscemi, Bob Balaban and Stanley Tucci. It is based on a discrepancy noticed over 2,000 years ago, that the first chapter of Genesis says male and female were created together, while the better known tale of Eve being created from Adam's rib comes in Chapter Two.

The legend of Lilith emerges from interpreters who were bold enough to say that she and Adam were together before Adam and Eve.

Then Adam made a power play for control, Lilith stood up to him saying they were made from the same stuff at the same time and he had no right to rule over her. After he threatens her, she runs away. Eve comes along and just to make sure no one misses the point of her supposedly leading him into temptation, her punishment concludes: "Your desire shall be for your husband, yet he will rule over you."

If you weren't convinced before of the need to bring critical thinking to life, this is a perfect case. As it turns out, the serpent, with its regular shedding, was apparently a power symbol for women in an ancient Near East that was matriarchal with females as the equivalent of presidents. Aryans from the north who had chariots and composite bows invaded, took over and installed a male dominated society complete with a story about how women and serpents couldn't be trusted.

Now, I know women who believe their place is in the home, and men who are happy to be stay-at-home dads, and that's all fine, because it is their choice. When we talk about implicit bias regarding race, however, we also need to acknowledge the implicit bias about women's place in the world that the Eden myth, if read literally, leads to. So whoever we support for our President this month, may we uproot the remaining effects of the longstanding, deep-rooted impact of that story and learn as progressive Jews how to re-read the Torah and life on multiple levels.



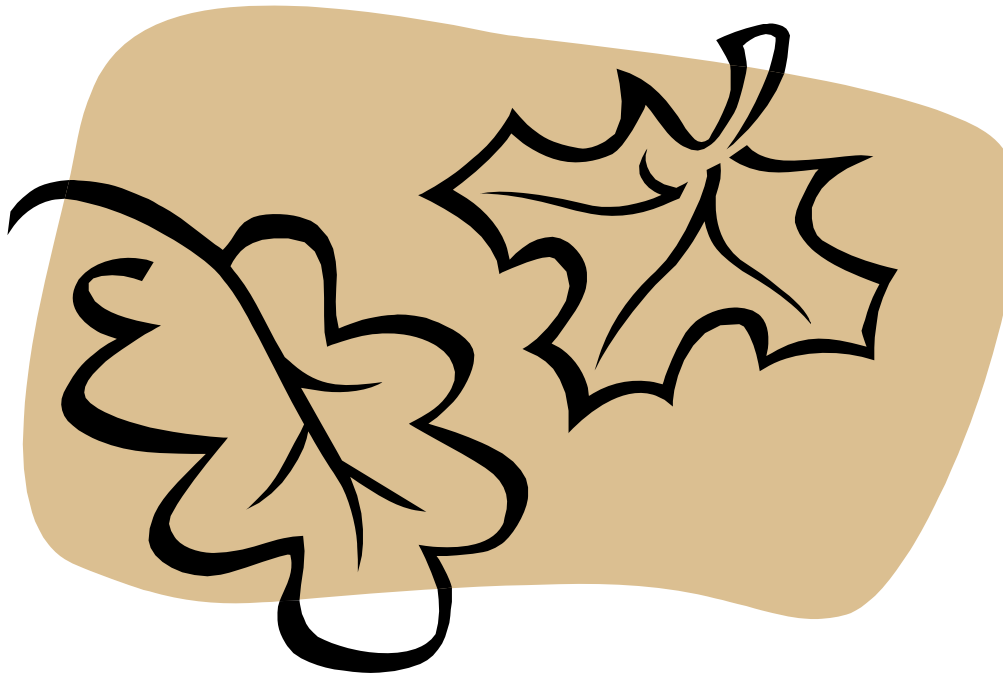
